I. THE ABRAHAMIC COVENANT

- A. The Key Passages For The Covenant. (Gen 12:1-3; 17:2, 4, 7, 21; [13:14-17; 15:1-21; 17:1-27; 22:15-18])
 - 1. The Initial Statement of the Covenant. Gen 12:1-3
 - 2. The Restatement of the Covenant With More Details (Gen 17), Statement of Certainty (v. 2, 21), Statement of the Divine Covenant (vv. 2, 4, 7, 9, 10, 11, 13, 14, 19, 21), Statement of Perpetuity (vv. 7, 9, 10,19), & Statement of Extension (v. 19).

The Provisions Of The Covenant: Personal Blessings To Abraham: (Blessed, A Great Nation, Produce Many Nations, Prosperous, A Home Land Forever, & Would Produce Kings); National Blessings To Abraham's Descendants (Passed On To Isaac And Jacob, A National Existence, The Nation Will Be Great, Will Have A Land Forever, A Continuing Covenant); & Universal Blessing For Everyone (All The Families Of The Earth Would Receive A Blessing Through The Physical Descendants Of Abraham).
- C. The Nature Of The Covenant: Unconditional & Everlasting.
 - 1. It Is an Unconditional Covenant.
 - a) The "I Will" Statements of the LORD. (E.G., Gen 12:1-3)
 - b) The Reiterations of the Covenant. (Gen 17:1-2; 22:16-18; 26:3-5)
 - c) Other Passages Indicate the Covenant Is Unconditional Nature. (Gen 50:24; Ex 2:24; Dt 4:31; 9:5-6; 2Kg 13:23; Lk 1:67-75; Acts 3:25-26; Heb 6:13, 17-18)
 - d) Summary for the Unconditionality of the Abrahamic Covenant.
 - (1) All Israel's Covenants Are Unconditional Except for the Mosaic Covenant.
 - (2) No Condition Is Stated.
 - (3) The Confirmation of the Covenant Was Unconditional.
 - (4) The Covenant Was Confirmed by an Unqualified Oath by God. (Heb 6:13)
 - (5) The Sign of the Covenant, Circumcision Was Not a Condition.
 - (6) The Covenant Was Restated to Isaac and Jacob With no Condition.
 - (7) The Covenant Was Confirmed Despite Disobedience.
 - (8) The Covenant Was Confirmed Despite Apostasy.
 - (9) The Covenant Was Declared To Be Immutable.
 - (10) The Unconditionality of the Covenant Is Confirmed by Later Revelation.
 - 2. It Is an Everlasting Covenant. (Gen 13:15; <u>17:7</u>, <u>13</u>, <u>19</u>; 1Chr 16:16-17)
- D. The Fulfillment Of The Covenant.
 - 1. It Was Not Fulfilled...
 - a) In Abraham's Lifetime Because It Is Passed on to Isaac. (Gen 17:19; 26:1-5)
 - b) In Isaac's Lifetime Because It Is Passed on to Jacob. (Gen 28:12-15)
 - c) In the Time of Moses Because Moses Reminds God of his Promise to Abraham. (Ex 32)
 - d) In the Times of the Kings of Israel, Because God Did Not Destroy the Nation Due to his Covenant With Abraham. (2Kgs 13)
 - 2. It Will Be Fulfilled in the Future.

- A. The Strategic Significance Of The Land: Theological Significance Center of God's Work; Religious Significance Center of 3 Religions; Economic Significance Center of World Commerce; Political Significance Center of Middle East.
- B. The Connection To The Abrahamic Covenant. (Gen 12:1; 13:14-17; 15:18-21; 17:8)

Reiteration, Repetition, Reaffirmation of the Land Promise. (Gen 12:1 with v. 7; 13:14-15, 17; 15:7; 17:7-8; Num 34:1-15; Dt 30:5; Josh 1:2; 1Kgs 8:33-34; 9:7; 2Kgs 21:8; Neh 9:8ff; Jer 7:1-15; Ezk 11:15 & 17; 36:28; Acts 1:6; Acts 3:21; Rom 11:11-12; Rev 20-21 w/ Zech 14)

 - 1. Not Fulfilled in the Old Testament Times; Joshua (Josh 11:23; 21:43-45) or Solomon (1Kings 4:20, 21); or in the New Testament Times; or Now.
 - 2. Fulfilled in the Future: in Connection to the New Covenant (Dt 30:1-6) & the Coming of the Messiah (Jer 23:1-8)

 - 1. It Is Connected to the Initial Giving of the Abrahamic Covenant. (Gen 12:1-3)
 - 2. It Is Connected to the Reiteration of the Abrahamic Covenant in Gen 17. (Gen 17:6)
 - 3. It Is Connected to the Abrahamic Covenant Through Judah, the Son of Jacob. (Gen 49:8-12 [Esp. V. 10])

 - 2. It Is an Unconditional Covenant: I Will Statements of God. (2Sam 7:12-14; Ps 89:3, 4, 20, 23, 25, 27, 28, 29, 32, 33, 34, 35; & Isa 9:6-7.

- B. The Parties Of The Covenant: The Lord God (Jer 31:31) & The Nation Of Israel: With The House Of Israel And The House Of Judah, With The House Of Israel. (Jer 31:31, 33)
- C. The Provisions Of The Covenant.
 - 1. The Jews Will Be Given a New Heart. (Ezk 11:19; 18:31; 36:26)
 - 2. The Jews Will Be Given a New Spirit or the Spirit of God. (Isa 32:15; 34:16; 44:3; 59:21; Ezk 11:19; 18:31; 36:26-27; 37:14; 39:29; Joel 2:28-29; Zech 12:10)
 - The Jews Will Have Forgiveness of Sins and Cleansing.
 - 4. The Jews' Relationship With God Will Be Restored, "my People, Your God." (Hos 1 & 2)
- D. The Nature Of The Covenant: Unconditional & Everlasting (Isa 55:3; 59:21; 61:8).
- E. The Fulfillment Of The Covenant: End Of The Tribulation Before The Millennial Kingdom. (See Rom 11:16-17)
- F. Summary Of The New Covenant
 - 1. It Is a Covenant Between God and the Nation of Israel.
 - 2. The Provisions of the New Covenant Are:
 - a) It Is an Unconditional Covenant. Jer 31; Ezk 16:60-62
 - b) It Is an Everlasting Covenant. Isa 61:2; Ezk 37:26; Jer 31:35-37
 - c) It Restores Favor and Blessing. His 2:19-20; Isa 61:9
 - d) Imparts Regeneration to its Recipients (Renewed Heart and Mind). Jer 31:33; Isa 59:21
 - e) Includes the Restoration of Favor and Blessing to the Nation of Israel.
 - f) Provides the Forgiveness of Sins. Jer 31:24b
 - Includes the Indwelling of the Holy Spirit in the Recipients. Jer 31:33; Ezk 36:27
 - h) Includes the Teaching Ministry of the Holy Spirit To and in the Recipients. Jer 31:34
 - i) Includes Material Blessing for the Nation of Israel. Jer 32:41; Isa 61:8; Ezk 37:26-27
 - j) Includes the Rebuilding of the Temple. Ezk 37:26-27a
 - k) Brings Peace. Hos 2:18
 - l) Is Based on the Shed Blood of the Messiah. Zech 9:11
 - 3. The Nature of the New Covenant Is: Literal, Eternal, Unconditional, Gracious, a Blessing, & Future.
 - The Fulfillment of the New Covenant Is: At the Second Coming of the Lord Jesus & Before the Millennial Kingdom.
